Terms and Reasons for Conditions

Under section 88(1)(c) of the EP&A Regulation, the consent authority must provide the terms of all conditions and reasons for imposing the conditions other than the conditions prescribed under section 4.17(11) of the EP&A Act. The terms of the conditions and reasons are set out below.

General Conditions

1	<p>Compliance with Building Code of Australia and insurance requirements under Home Building Act 1989</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. It is a condition of a development consent for development that involves building work that the work must be carried out in accordance with the requirements of the Building Code of Australia. 2. It is a condition of a development consent for development that involves residential building work for which a contract of insurance is required under the Home Building Act 1989, Part 6 that a contract of insurance is in force before building work authorised to be carried out by the consent commences. 3. It is a condition of a development consent for a temporary structure used as an entertainment venue that the temporary structure must comply with Part B1 and NSW Part H102 in Volume 1 of the Building Code of Australia. 4. In subsection (1), a reference to the Building Code of Australia is a reference to the Building Code of Australia as in force on the day on which the application for the construction certificate was made. 5. In subsection (3), a reference to the Building Code of Australia is a reference to the Building Code of Australia as in force on the day on which the application for development consent was made. 6. This section does not apply— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. to the extent to which an exemption from a provision of the Building Code of Australia or a fire safety standard is in force under the Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021, or b. to the erection of a temporary building, other than a temporary structure to which subsection (3) applies. <p>Condition reason: Prescribed condition under section 69 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021.</p>
2	<p>Erection of signs</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. This section applies to a development consent for development involving building work, subdivision work or demolition work. 2. It is a condition of the development consent that a sign must be erected in a prominent position on a site on which building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. showing the name, address and telephone number of the principal certifier for the work, and

- b. showing the name of the principal contractor, if any, for the building work and a telephone number on which the principal contractor may be contacted outside working hours, and
 - c. stating that unauthorised entry to the work site is prohibited.
3. The sign must be—
- a. maintained while the building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out, and
 - b. removed when the work has been completed.
4. This section does not apply in relation to—
- a. building work, subdivision work or demolition work carried out inside an existing building, if the work does not affect the external walls of the building, or
 - b. Crown building work certified to comply with the Building Code of Australia under the Act, Part 6.

Condition reason: Prescribed condition under section 70 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021.

For the avoidance of doubt, this consent relates only to Lot 68 DP3378 and 72 DP3378.

Condition reason: To ensure all parties are aware of the approved plans and supporting documentation that applies to the development.

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Stormwater

Stormwater from:

- All roof areas;
- Surface water from paved and impervious areas; and
- Any overflow from tanks (if applicable)

is to be collected and conveyed within the site in a controlled manner and away from footings.

Condition reason: To prevent flooding or nuisance to existing buildings and neighbouring properties as a result of the development.

Non- reflective external facing materials shall be used.

	Condition reason: In the interests of amenity.
6	Demolition Any demolition is to be carried out in accordance with <i>AS2601 – Demolition of Structures</i> . Condition reason: To ensure the work is undertaken safely and as required pursuant to the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000 and Work Health and Safety (WHS) Regulation 2011.

Before building work commences

8	Erosion and sediment controls in place Before any site work commences, the principal certifier must be satisfied suitable erosion and sediment controls are in place. These controls must remain in place until any bare earth has been restabilised in accordance with the erosion and sediment control plan. Condition reason: To ensure sediment laden runoff and site debris do not impact local stormwater systems and waterways.
9	Construction Certificate In accordance with the provisions of Section 6.6 and 6.7 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, construction works approved by this consent must not commence until: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. a Construction Certificate has been issued; 2. the NSW Planning Portal has been advised of; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the intention to commence work; and • the specific Principal Certifying Authority (building inspector) that has been appointed to the project. Documentation required under this condition must show that the proposal complies with all

relevant development consent conditions and is not inconsistent with the approved plans, the Building Code of Australia and the relevant Australian Standards.

Condition reason: To ensure a Construction Certificate is applied for.

During building work

11	<p>Hours of work</p> <p>Site work must only be carried out between the following times –</p> <p>7am - 6pm Monday to Friday & 8am - 1pm Saturday</p> <p>Site work is not to be carried out outside of these times except where there is an emergency, or for urgent work directed by a police officer or a public authority.</p> <p>Condition reason: To protect the amenity of the surrounding area.</p>
12	<p>Noise and Vibration requirements</p> <p>While site work is being carried out, noise generated from the site must not exceed an LAeq (15 min) of 5dB(A) above background noise, when measured at a lot boundary of the site.</p> <p>Condition reason: To protect the amenity of the neighbourhood during construction.</p>
13	<p>Procedure for critical stage inspections</p> <p>While building work is being carried out, the work must not continue after each critical stage inspection unless the principal certifier is satisfied the work may proceed in accordance with this consent and the relevant construction certificate.</p> <p>Condition reason: To require approval to proceed with building work following each critical stage inspection.</p>
14	<p>Plumbing and Drainage</p> <p>Any relevant plumbing and drainage work shall comply with the <i>Plumbing and Drainage Act 2011</i>, <i>Plumbing and Drainage Australian Standard AS3500</i>, <i>Plumbing Regulations 2017</i> and the <i>Plumbing Code of Australia (NCC 2016)</i>.</p> <p>Condition reason: To ensure the work complies with relevant standards.</p>

15	During Construction - Amenity
	During the construction of the development, the following is to be adhered to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Effective dust control measures are to be maintained; and • No materials are to be burned on site. Waste is to be removed from the site.
	Condition reason: In the interests of amenity.

Before issue of an occupation certificate

16	Occupation Certificate
	The relevant Occupation Certificate must be obtained before use of the building commences.
	ADVISING: Failure to obtain an Occupation Certificate is an offence under the legislation
Condition reason: To ensure the building is suitable for occupation (in accordance with its BCA classification).	

Occupation and ongoing use

17	Use Limitations
	The approved development shall: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • be used in an ancillary manner to the existing use of the land (Golf Course), and • not be used for any commercial or industrial purpose (unless deemed exempt) without further planning permission.
	Condition reason: In the interests of amenity and to ensure the use meets the BCA classification.

General advisory notes

This consent contains the conditions imposed by the consent authority which are to be complied with when carrying out the approved development. However, this consent is not an exhaustive list of all obligations which may relate to the carrying out of the development under the EP&A Act, EP&A Regulation and other legislation. Some of these additional obligations are set out in the [Conditions of development consent: advisory notes](#). The consent should be read together with the *Conditions of development consent: advisory notes* to ensure the development is carried out lawfully.

The approved development must be carried out in accordance with the conditions of this consent. It is an offence under the EP&A Act to carry out development that is not in accordance with this consent. Building work or subdivision work must not be carried out until a construction certificate or subdivision works certificate, respectively, has been issued and a principal certifier has been appointed.

A document referred to in this consent is taken to be a reference to the version of that document which applies at the date the consent is issued, unless otherwise stated in the conditions of this consent.

Dictionary

The following terms have the following meanings for the purpose of this determination (except where the context clearly indicates otherwise):

Approved plans and documents means the plans and documents endorsed by the consent authority, a copy of which is included in this notice of determination.

AS means Australian Standard published by Standards Australia International Limited and means the current standard which applies at the time the consent is issued.

Building work means any physical activity involved in the erection of a building.

Certifier means a council or a person that is registered to carry out certification work under the *Building and Development Certifiers Act 2018*.

Construction certificate means a certificate to the effect that building work completed in accordance with specified plans and specifications or standards will comply with the requirements of the EP&A Regulation and *Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021*.

Council means URALLA SHIRE COUNCIL.

Court means the Land and Environment Court of NSW.

EPA means the NSW Environment Protection Authority.

EP&A Act means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

EP&A Regulation means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021*.

Independent Planning Commission means Independent Planning Commission of New South Wales constituted by section 2.7 of the EP&A Act.

Occupation certificate means a certificate that authorises the occupation and use of a new building or a change of building use for an existing building in accordance with this consent.

Principal certifier means the certifier appointed as the principal certifier for building work or subdivision work under section 6.6(1) or 6.12(1) of the EP&A Act respectively.

Site work means any work that is physically carried out on the land to which the development the subject of this development consent is to be carried out, including but not limited to building work, subdivision work, demolition work, clearing of vegetation or remediation work.

Stormwater drainage system means all works and facilities relating to:

- the collection of stormwater,
- the reuse of stormwater,
- the detention of stormwater,
- the controlled release of stormwater, and
- connections to easements and public stormwater systems.

Strata certificate means a certificate in the approved form issued under Part 4 of the *Strata Schemes Development Act 2015* that authorises the registration of a strata plan, strata plan of subdivision or notice of conversion.

Sydney district or regional planning panel means Northern Regional Planning Panel.
